Lenten series will focus on the <u>letters to the seven churches in the book of Revelation</u>. Some of these churches were strongly rebuked while others were commended for their faithful witness. Most received rebuke *and* commendation. There is a lesson to be learned in each case.

The challenges and struggles of these churches are painfully similar to our contemporary setting. Ecclesiastes 1:9 explains, "What has been will be again, what has been done will be done again; there is nothing new under the sun." A closer look at the churches in Revelation will help us to better understand and consider the Lord's expectations for "His" church today. This is critical in a day and age where organizations claim the name of Jesus while blatantly denying His Word.

There will be a meal after all Lenten worship services *except on Ash Wednesday.* Breaking bread in fellowship together is a great way to transition from the darkness of winter to the light of spring. Lent services begin at 5 p.m. Meals will begin the second Wednesday at 5:45 p.m. on March 12. Everyone is encouraged to join in fellowship and worship as we consider the sacrifice of our Lord Jesus.
